The academic calendar is prepared to streamline the working days, observation days and holidays etc. The faculty members prepare lesson plans, take lesson notes and maintain progress registers which is verified by the respective heads of the Departments, the Academic Bursar and the Principal. Academic Audit is done from time to time. Proctorial system is meant to redress personal difficulties and provide counselling to students. All sections function in complete abidance to the regulations stated by the Higher Education Department and the affiliating University. There is a Governing Body that considers all major decisions taken at the institution level and gives approval, which then are placed for the approval of the next Higher Authorities.
